



# Announcing the Second Annual “Moving Beyond Implications” Conference!

CT SSN is excited to partner with Representative Jaime Foster (D-57 (Ellington, East Windsor, and Vernon)), Representative Dominique Johnson (D-143 (Norwalk and Westport)), and UConn’s InCHIP to host the second annual “Moving Beyond Implications: Research into Policy” (Moving Beyond) conference. The conference will bring together academics, legislators, and other policymakers in advance of the 2025 Connecticut legislative session.

*Moving Beyond* creates an opportunity for researchers to present their policy-relevant scholarship to policymakers, provide an opportunity for policymakers to respond with their research needs and questions, and generate connections to inform evidence-based policymaking in Connecticut.

**When and Where is *Moving Beyond*?** The Conference will be held on Thursday, December 12, 2024. Lunch will be available at 11:30am and conference programming will take place from 12-6pm at the Legislative Office Building in Hartford, Connecticut.

**Which Legislators Will Attend *Moving Beyond*?** All members of the Connecticut General Assembly are invited to attend. We will once again invite leadership from the Governor’s Office, General Assembly, and the many offices that implement Connecticut’s policies and programs.

**How Can Researchers Participate in *Moving Beyond*?** There are three ways to participate in *Moving Beyond*: present, submit, and/or attend!

Present: If you have policy relevant research, we are excited to hear from you! We can accommodate up to sixteen 15-minute researcher-led presentations throughout the conference. If you are interested in presenting, please submit an abstract for consideration by **Friday, November 1st, at 12pm eastern**. Presenters will be notified of selection by **Tuesday, November 12<sup>th</sup>**. Submission instructions are below.

Submit: We will append policy briefs to the conference program. We invite 1-2 page research or policy briefs from both those who are selected to present and those who are not able to present. Briefs are due by **Monday, November 25<sup>th</sup>, at 12pm**. Submission instructions are below.

Attend: This conference is open to all CT SSN members, SSN members from other chapters, and researchers without a SSN affiliation. Space may be limited. Conference registration is due by **Friday, December 6, 2024, at 5pm**. Please [RSVP here](#) to attend!

**Will CT SSN or InCHIP Help Me to Prepare for *Moving Beyond*?** Yes! There will be three opportunities!

1. UConn's InCHIP will hosted a virtual workshop on **Tuesday, October 22 from 12pm – 1pm** eastern on how to write briefs. This included tips on how to use your briefs to talk to policymakers and convert them into op-eds. You can view the [training here](#).
2. The National SSN has agreed to host a virtual training on **Monday, November 18<sup>th</sup> from 10am -12pm** eastern focused on how to present to policymakers. The training will be tailored to presenters and those submitting briefs, but it is also open to all CT SSN members. **Presentation Submission Instructions:** If you’d like to present please submit your information and abstract to CT SSN via email.

*Research submission:*

Research presentations may present a particular research project (for example, the findings from a grant project, a particular paper, or something else that’s focused) or you may summarize key or novel findings from your recent research (this would be summative and might pull from your work AND the work of other researchers).

Please indicate your submissions research type:

- Focused research project
- Summative research presentation

Then address the following:

8. How is your/this research relevant to Connecticut policymakers? Examples might include a link between your research and recent legislation, an area of need in Connecticut that has not been addressed by Connecticut policy, the way Connecticut is affected by a national phenomenon, etc.
9. A 500-600 word abstract about the research or research area you will present at *Moving Beyond*. Research presentations are meant to give an overview of research. Therefore, your abstract should address the following: (1) the research area you will address, (2) an overview of the state of knowledge in your chosen research area, and (3) key policy takeaways.

*Please note*, those selected for presentation will also be asked to submit a 1-2 page brief to append to the program. The brief submission is not required as part of your abstract submission and may be done separately. When you are notified if you are selected to present, we will also prompt you to complete your brief.

Please submit an abstract for consideration by **Friday, November 1st, at 12pm eastern**. Presenters will be notified of presenter selections by **Tuesday, November 12<sup>th</sup>**. 7. Your 1-2 page brief which should include:
  - (1) The research area/ question you are addressing,
  - (2) How this area affects Connecticut: Examples might include a link between your research and recent legislation, an area of need in Connecticut that has not been addressed by Connecticut policy, the way Connecticut is affected by a national phenomenon, etc.
  - (3) An overview of the state of knowledge in your chosen research area, and
  - (4) Key policy takeaways.
